1	<u>Abortion Expansion Bill, Public Act No. 22-19 (formerly HB5414)</u> , encourages nurses & midwives to perform abortions in CT.	passed
2	<u>Public Act 21-17 (formerly SB835)</u> the anti-pregnancy center bill designed to put Connecticut's pregnancy resource centers out-of-business through frivolous claims of deceptive advertising.	passed
3* weighted 1/2 of score	<u>Public Health and Judiciary Committee votes on Senate Bill 88 - the 2022 Assisted Suicide bill</u> which would have permitted doctors to falsify death certificates and prescribe experimental poison combinations; <u>2021 Committee Vote on HB 6425 & AS bill co-sponsorship ('21c, '22C)</u> .	failed Jud. Comm. vote
